Letter from the Vicar


Dear all

Welcome to our joint December and January newsletter, which is full of information about all our Advent and Christmas services and activities, but also begins to point us beyond 25th December into a New Year. Do look at everything that is going on, as we travel through this festive season together.




In Advent we prepare ourselves for the birth of Jesus, the incarnation of the divine into human flesh. Whilst the Easter story, with its focus on resurrection, lies at the heart of the Christian

faith, I have always felt that we rather leave the incarnation out of our theology much of the time, that might give one the impression faith is all about the cross of Jesus, rather than the life lived. It isn't; it is both/and. Gregory of Nazianzus, a fourth century Archbishop of Constantinople, once said, 'What Christ has not been, Christ has not healed.' Meaning



that the incarnation, which takes up human flesh, the human experience, the human struggle, and dwells in it from the inside, has opened up redemption and wholeness to all of humanity; all of it scooped into Jesus' life, death and resurrection. So that humanity



is brought fully alive. As Jesus said, 'I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly' (John 10.10). As Irenaeus, an early church father said, 'The glory of God is a human being fully alive.' The incarnation literally means the dwelling of the divine in human flesh: the incarnation is for Life, not just for Christmas.

But how are we to live life 'abundantly'? The astonishing truth that God's Son took on human flesh to live among us is hard to get our heads round. But this is not some remote God looking upon us from afar, smiling benignly at us. This is the divine life in human form, Jesus Christ, living amongst us, living within us, showing us what a human life, filled with God's loving Spirit, looks like, when it allows the divine to shine through. Did you know the same call



is to us? That filled with God's divine life ourselves, through the gift of Jesus Christ, we are called to live the Christian faith in an incarnational way. By which I mean the faith, its values, its loving inclusivity, its power to transform lives – and yes, its overwhelming joy, peace and confidence to live our life well - flows through us, if we let it, and is embedded in what we say and do, how we behave, and how we share that love with a world in need.

So as December soon turns to January, and as we begin to look at how we live this abundant life we have been given, it seems a good time to introduce Bishop Stephen's vision for the Diocese of Salisbury. For it is all about incarnational living.

You will be hearing more about this over the coming weeks and months, but Bishop Stephen, through his work in and with the Diocese, has identified 5 areas in which we should consider our mission and ministry. The overall aim of the vision, 'Making Jesus known' is one to which we can all agree. The five areas are:.

- I. Courageous Christian Leadership
- 2. Championing Climate Justice
- 3. Forming creative partnerships in local mission
- 4. Working for justice

And the fifth, which underpins this works and helps to make it possible, is:

5. Commit to building a sustainable financial future for the Church.

There are some aspects St John's is already doing in these key areas:

- 1. We share ministry together at St John's, and our corporate life is vibrant, but there is still much we could do in developing the confidence of leaders to come forward as together we find ways of speaking and showing God's love into a world that needs to hear this message of hope and love.
- 2. Our Eco Group, which has achieved Bronze Award as Eco Church, is now helping us towards our Silver Award, and we are currently measuring our carbon footprint, planting up wildflower areas, and have additionally achieved a Dorset Wildlife Plaque for our work. Muddy Church



engages with a love of nature and creating sustainable ways of living as we work towards ecoconscious lives. As Churches Together In Broadstone we now have a joint Eco Group, helping the four churches to work together for their awards. But we cannot be complacent.

3. We have fantastic partnerships with the other churches in Churches Together, sharing Lent Groups, Christmas cards, Unity services, sharing calendars so our activities are complementary, not competitive, advertising each others' work, and so on. There is more to be done, but we are already a highly functioning Churches Together. We also seek to build deeper partnerships with school contacts, are exploring work with the YMCA, have developed partnerships with the NHS and local surgeries, and so on. We





need them as much as they need us.

- 4. Again through Churches Together we have a joint Justice and Peace Group, but there is still much to do in developing and taking this work forward. We seek to speak out against injustice and bring justice and peace wherever we can. That St John's has joined the Inclusive Church network is part of this work, longing for equality for all human beings.
- 5. Well, I wish I knew the answer to this one! We have just had our annual stewardship appeal explaining church finances, but we all need to find ways

of making finances sustainable, though our creative partnership with the Sunny Days preschool has given us a huge support in terms of received income.

To conclude, I pray that our shared Advent is a time of waiting, preparation and expectancy as we look towards celebrating the Incarnation – God coming as a baby – to change our world. And I pray too, that as we move into a New Year, our understanding of how best to live our lives incarnationally in the light of God's love – and in the light of the Diocesan vision - will grow and gather. May we all know life in all its abundance.
