## Letter from the Vicar

Dear friends,

There is an exciting project happening locally I want to tell you about. Just recently St Nicholas' Church in Corfe Mullen was identified within the Diocese of Salisbury as a 'Mission Hub Church' and was successful in its bid to secure some national funding for a Community Lead post. A Mission Hub is a church



which has the ability to help train, resource and encourage other churches in the work they are doing, and in partnering churches together.



I have been involved in the appointment of this new Community Lead, taking part in her interviews recently. Rachel Stevens, who we were delighted to appoint, began her work in October, and because the Vicar at Corfe Mullen, Revd Jane Burgess, has just retired and they are now in vacancy, I have agreed to give Rachel some mentoring support until her new vicar is appointed, and will be meeting with her every couple of months.

So what is the connection to St John's? It is recognised that traditionally churches work within their own parishes, and we all usually do our own thing, never crossing the parish boundary. Rare is it for any joint missional initiatives to take place where parishes are working together on something. However, if that can be achieved, then sharing of resources becomes possible, with a crossfertilisation of best practice learning and establishing of joint ministries.

It is with this possibility in mind that the Community Lead post has been created. Rachel's remit is to work with other willing local churches as we help to enable each other in our community work. She hopes to create partnerships with local churches, help resource them, help them to work together rather than duplicating work in each church. She hopes to build connections between local churches and the wider community with whom we have the potential to partner, be it schools, charities or



community groups. This directly taps into one of our own named objectives this year, to seek creative partnerships and develop network possibilities.

I invited Rachel to come to our last Churches Together in Broadstone meeting to explain all this to the CTiB group, and she was met with a warm reception. All our churches consider this an exciting development and look forward to seeing how we might work with Rachel and also support and enable Rachel's work.

It coincides with a new development at the URC Church, as they start a project, a Mission House, for students to come and train and work with them. Taylor Hawkins has just taken on this role, and provides another resource. It seems that collaboration could well and truly be alive across Broadstone and Corfe Mullen!

### The Changing Seasons and the Sundays' Themes

Autumn seems to have come so quickly! Here we are at November already, a season which, liturgically, has always been about memory, Remembrance and also God's Kingdom. It seems to me there is a strong emotion to it all, a sense of longing and loss, into which God pours his comfort and his peace. The whole of November is usually what we call 'Kingdom Season', and the



readings reflect this, as they summon the most apocalyptic parts of our Bible (those passages that seem to signal 'end times'), which may actually not be about the end of the world per se, but the end of 'the world as they knew it' i.e. seismic shifts that were going on in and just after Jesus' day.



Within this season, we have four distinct Sundays (it doesn't always map directly onto November as sometimes this season

starts right at the end of October, depending when the Sunday falls). The first is All Saints and All Souls. In the morning we celebrate the lives of saints and the great cloud of witnesses of the saints who surround us and have gone



before. We remember too, that we are God's saints, here on earth, even on the days we don't feel like we are! Then in the afternoon, we turn to All Souls, and our memorial service for those we have loved and lost.

Not an easy service, but moving, powerful and, I think, necessary for our remembering and healing.



The second is Remembrance Sunday, when we remember those who lost their lives in war – not just the two World Wars, but all wars since. The importance of remembering is crucial. We not only honour those who died but we keep alive the memory of the destruction war brings and how we must do all we can to work for peace.

Our third Sunday in this season is Kingdom 3 (because the previous two Sundays are also Kingdom I and 2, even though they go by other names). We see our own earthly lives in the context of the Kingdom Of God, of how we bring the values of that kingdom into our lives today, and how

we also retain our hope that God's Kingdom will one day come on earth, as it is in heaven.

Our final Sunday is also our final Sunday of the Church Year: seasonally it is the 'New Years' Eve' of the church calendar of Sundays. And while it is Kingdom 4, its main name is the Festival of Christ the King. This is the reminder that Christ ascended as a King, and it references to the idea of the second coming, that Christ will come again as King and his rule will be over all. We celebrate Christ's triumph over all the sadness and memories and loss that we might have experienced during this month, even during this year, and recognise all is held safe in his arms. One day, all shall be put right.



How wonderful that we end the Church Year on a high note, Christ the King, the one who will come again in power and might. That ushers us into the start of the Church New Year with the season of Advent, as we anticipate Christ's first coming as a baby, with all that growing into his kingship he will do. And so the cycle of the seasons – and the year - begins again. Begins with the baby, who began it all.


I do pray you find this season rich with meaning, and in the midst of whatever sadness or difficulty there may be for you now, the promise of the hope that is coming. Revd Helen

### From the St John's Eco Gang...



#### **ECO TIPS FOR HELPING HEDGEHOGS**

We have hedgehogs using our churchyard – hooray! Hedgehog numbers are in decline in the countryside. The good news is that they can thrive in gardens (and churchyards) so we can all help them out. Here are some hedgehog tips from Eco Church organisers A Rocha UK:

- Put a pile of hay, straw, or leaves under a dry shed, log pile or thick hedge in the garden for a safe place to hibernate. Alternatively you can buy or make a hedgehog house.
- Leave wild areas for foraging.
- Avoid using slug pellets and pesticides.
- Don't interfere with nests and be especially careful when working in the garden and strimming.
- Make small holes in walls or fences allowing hedgehogs to move freely between gardens (they need about 15 gardens to forage).
- Where there are ponds, ensure there is a safe way to climb out. Hedgehogs are great swimmers, but they struggle to climb out of steep-sided ponds.
- If you want to feed them, leave out pet food, not milk. Lactose upsets hedgehogs' digestion. If you see a hedgehog or evidence of one, you can record it online at irecord.org.uk and we'd love to know too. THE ECO GANG
