NEW PARKING AT THE PARISH HALL As you know, parking is very limited during the working week when the nursery Sunny Days is in. If there is room, you are allowed to park but ONLY on church business - for no other reason. You must only park in a way that uses a genuine space and MUST NOT block anyone in nor prevent emergency access to the hall by a vehicle from the gate. If there is no room, please try parking outside NR annexe off Dunyeats Rd, or Tudor Rd etc. Wednesday morning the fence for their playground does not go up until 12 noon because of our weekly Eucharist. NEW STRICTLY NO ACCESS TO PARISH HALL ITSELF MON TO FRI 7.30am -

6.25pm Sunny Days has let me know that a handful of people have been knocking on the doors of Sunny Days during their working hours to ask to use the toilet. This is a reminder that there is strictly no access to the building for any reason whatsoever Mon to Fri 7.30am to 6.25pm. It breaks safeguarding policies and disturbs the staff, taking them away from the children they are supervising. I have told Sunny Days staff that if anyone comes to the door, to not let them in, because they are simply not allowed to do so. APCM: PCC MEMBERS We now have enough people standing for the PCC roles, many thanks to those people for putting their names forward. Although this doesn't stop others applying and going to a vote! Please have a word with the vicar if you would like to get involved.

AMENDED APCM: ELECTORAL ROLL Every 6 years the whole electoral roll has to be revised, which means everyone on it needs to reapply. Envelopes are now available for you to collect from the Parish Office or during services, which will contain a letter from us and an electoral roll form for you to fill in. The internal deadline for getting these back to Geraldine Willford, our Electoral Roll officer, via the parish office, will be 3rd April, and the roll will formally close on 10th April, after which no one else can be added to the roll until after the APCM on 1st May. Please note that you can only attend the APCM if you are an electoral roll member.

APCM: ARE YOU NEW TO CHURCH? If you are new to church and have decided to make St John's your church and have worshipped with us for 6 months, or you live in the parish, you can become a member of our electoral roll, providing you are over 16, baptised and not on any other electoral roll. Do have a word with the Vicar or Geraldine Willford about this. You can only attend the APCM and nominate and vote for our charities if you are on our electoral roll, and it also means you will receive all the papers for the APCM including the parish and statutory reports, the financial reports, as well as later in the year our stewardship packs. Because the roll is about to be revised (see note above), we will be taking in new electoral rolls from 9th March - and you will be added to the roll at that time.
