NEW Teaching and Learning Opportunities and Spiritual Nurture at St John's At the APCM Revd Helen said one of our three main focuses for life at St John's this year was discipleship and a chance to develop both our understanding and our practice of our Christian faith. The notices below launch this new programme of opportunities to explore and engage in our faith, and give time to nurturing what we believe, why we believe it and how it makes a difference in our lives.

Thursday Morning Prayer in Church 8.45am Although we will **continue** to offer morning prayer on Wednesdays online and evening prayer on Fridays online, Revd Helen will also be relaunching Morning Prayer said in church (in the Lady Chapel) on Thursday mornings at 8.45am. Everyone is welcome to join her. This 20 - 25 minute prayer time in our beautiful church can be such a lovely way to start the day together. This begins this week on Thursday 25th July. Please note church will only be unlocked at 8.40am - if you arrive early, do just wait for me to come along. If there are any occasions it has to be cancelled due to my availability, I will put a note in the weekly news. Thank you. *Revd Helen*

Quiet Day at St John's, led by Revd Helen Bailey, Saturday 7th

September. Revd Helen will be leading us in a Quiet Day held in church, NorthReach annexe and the Parish Hall, as well as our church grounds. There will be some led sessions, but lots of quiet space and own time to read, pray, think, do a craft. Details of the day and timings / theme still to be announced, but is likely to start from around 9.30am and likely to finish around 3 - 3.30pm. You can come for some or all of the day. Sign up sheets and further details will emerge soon, but for now, do put the date in your diary.

House Group starting up again at St John's In the autumn Following on from the Quiet Day which will launch our new programme of teaching and learning opportunities, I am thrilled that our house group will be re-forming. Paul Winsworth and Ken Pearce will be leading this between them, rather than having separate house groups, and it will take place in NorthReach annexe and / or sometimes in church on a fortnightly basis. Day and time still to be announced. Over the summer a sign-up sheet will emerge and we will let you know the study guide we are using - which we have just bought in, and you will be able to buy from us at a considerable discount.

Getting to Grips with the Gospels In the autumn Revd Helen will launch a monthly session looking at our four Gospels. We know they are the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, but who wrote them, who did they write them for? How did they spread? How did they become part of our canon we call the New Testament? What was their context of the day? Together we will explore all this, plus what life was like in 1st century Palestine, which will help to make sense of what we hear and read in church on Sundays week by week. We will explore how we might helpfully approach scripture, and what we do with those 'difficult bits' we come across! These will take place on the second Saturday of the month, 9.45am (coffee), 10am start until 11am. There is no meeting in December however! Dates are: Saturday 12th October, Sat 9th November. Providing there is take-up for this, they will continue with Sat 11th January, Sat 8th Feb, Sat 8th March, Sat 12th April, Sat 3rd May (1 week earlier than usual), no meetings in June or July.

AMENDED ORGANIST APPOINTED AT ST JOHN'S A reminder that our new organist Peter Hoar will begin his post with us on 1st August and in the first instance will be playing for us for our Sunday services and additional main services throughout the year, while we will continue to use our circle of relief organists for funerals and weddings. We are also using our team of relief organists in July, as Peter starts with us in August.
