APCM, PCC MEMBERS AND OTHER ROLES The APCM will soon be upon us, so I need to advertise the need for new PCC Members. I shall be looking for **4 people to join the PCC this year** - if you are interested, have a word with me about it. There are other roles also becoming available, which are: churchwarden, PCC Secretary, Electoral Roll Officer and Safeguarding Officer, though we are in the happy position of people having already expressed an interest in standing for those roles. This does not preclude others standing, in which case there would be an election.

THE BIG ISSUE The Big Issue is a social enterprise designed to help people who are homeless or at risk of homelessness to earn their way out of poverty. It is an excellent scheme that affords the person the dignity of genuine employment. For every magazine sold, the vendor gets 50% of the profit. The money that vendors earn through selling the magazine helps vendors to cover rent and bills. It also offers vendors who are unable to maintain other jobs, due to mental health or other issues, the opportunity to earn their own income. There is usually a Big Issue vendor standing outside Tesco on our High Street in Broadstone. If you are able to support and buy a magazine, please do. It came up at a Churches Together meeting recently about how we can support them by reminding our congregations of the great scheme it is. Thank you.
